### **Medicine Regulations**

Following the 2014 regulations set by the DfE and Health and Safety Executive, schools are not allowed to hold and administer medicines unless they are prescribed for <u>on-going medical conditions</u> (i.e. asthma inhalers, epi-pens for extreme allergies, diabetes etc); antibiotics cannot be administered unless they have been prescribed for four times a day. We cannot administer Calpol, Ibuprofen or Aspirin and we are not allowed to put cream on children. We appreciate your co-operation on this matter. Thank you.
