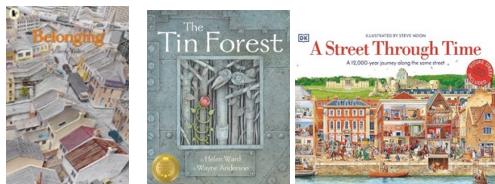


Overall Outcome

Children develop vocabulary relating to physical and human geographical features from KS1. They begin to develop the skills of comparing regions, by focusing on specific features.

Children focus on comparing regions of the UK in depth.

Children have a stronger understanding of the difference between physical and human geography. They use more precise vocabulary, explaining the processes of human geography and their significance, as well as beginning to understand the impact of humans on the earth.

Children begin to develop their map skills. They will be able to identify features on a map through the use of symbols and keys. Children begin to use fieldwork skills to monitor and explain patterns in human and physical features.

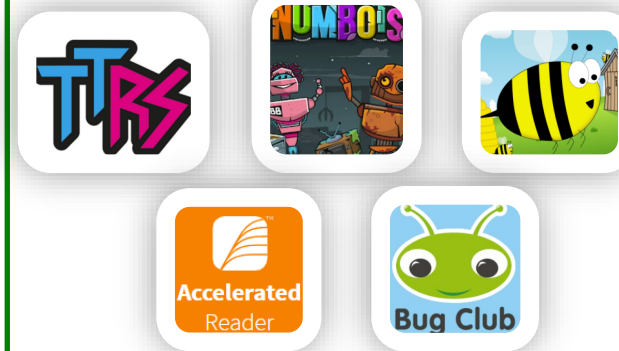
