- Spend a day in the woods to help light a fire, build a shelter and get muddy!

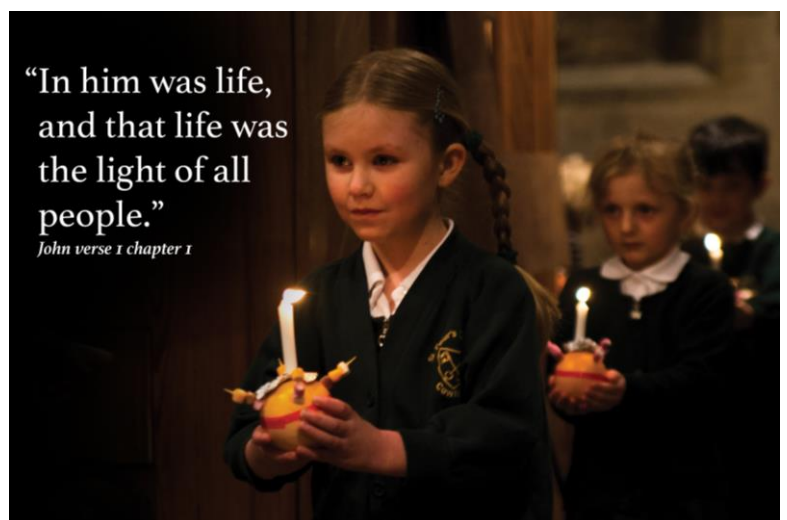
- Contribute to a special church service.

## How we can work in partnership for the benefit of our children.

### The school will:

- ❖ Care for each child's welfare, safety (including e-safety) and happiness.
- ❖ Encourage each child to do their best at all times.
- ❖ Develop each child's potential – socially, spiritually, culturally, academically and physically.
- ❖ Strive to achieve high standards of work, exemplary behaviour and a superb attitude by building excellent relationships and developing a sense of responsibility.
- ❖ Inform parents about the school curriculum and what we aim to teach the children each term.
- ❖ Discuss with parents about the progress their child is making at school and the next stages of learning.
- ❖ Inform parents of any important issues which relate to their child, and which may arise at school.
- ❖ Be understanding and supportive of families during difficult times such as illness, moving and so on.
- ❖ Be open and welcoming and offer opportunities for parents to become involved in the daily life of the school.
- ❖ Develop and maintain links with the local community.
- ❖ Respect all visitors to the school.

### We expect that parents / guardians will:

- ❖ Ensure that their child attends school regularly and arrives on time.
- ❖ Ensure that their child is wearing the correct school uniform and is properly equipped e.g. has PE kit and any books or stationery as required.
- ❖ Inform the school by 9.20am, at the latest, if their child cannot attend school.
- ❖ Let the school know of any concerns or problems that might affect their child at school.
- ❖ Support the school's Christian Ethos and policies.
- ❖ Encourage exemplary behaviour.
- ❖ Support their child in homework and other opportunities for home learning.
- ❖ Get to know about their child's life at school by attending parent consultation evenings, reading information sent out and ensuring good liaison between home and school.
- ❖ Get involved in the wider life of the school whenever possible.
- ❖ Ensure their child is safe on the internet and uses it responsibly.
- ❖ Respect all adults and children whilst visiting the school and when using social media sites like Facebook.
- ❖ Follow procedures for airing concerns and complaints and not use social media to do so.



## **We expect that pupils will:**

*(Parents – please discuss this with your child)*

- ❖ Do all their class work and homework as well as they can.
- ❖ Take responsibility for their own work and conduct.
- ❖ Be helpful and friendly to all.
- ❖ Treat other people and their belongings with care and respect.
- ❖ Respect all children, visitors and adults working in the school.
- ❖ Look after the school property, buildings and grounds.
- ❖ Follow internet safety rules and use computers or i-pads responsibly.

## **The school's governors will:**

- ❖ Encourage the upholding of the aims and Christian ethos of the school.
- ❖ Support the school's efforts in striving to provide an excellent, enjoyable and inclusive education.
- ❖ Promote good relationships and communication between the school, parents, governors and the wider community.
- ❖ Hold school leaders to account for spending the school budget in the most effective manner possible.
