1. Pupil Premium Pupils' Progress – Year 6 End of KS2 Estimated Progress

Due to the COVID pandemic and Lockdown there were no Yr6 SATS. This progress is based on Teacher Assessment of what the children would have got in SATS in 2021 and was assisted by gaining the average of past SATS papers from 2017, 18 & 19, sat in test conditions.

The Year 6 pupils, who also had the catch-up intervention during the Autumn Term 2020, have made good progress. The Year 6 pupils, who also had the catch-up intervention during the Autumn Term 2020, have made good progress. In May and June 2021 Year 6 sat past SATS papers in test conditions. The data showed good progress from Key Stage 1 for all 3 Year 6 PP Pupils. B doing particularly well as he was Working Towards in the Year 2 Statutory Assessments in 2017. This provides evidence for the effective 'Quality First Teaching' the pupils received over Key Stage 2 (Year 6 in particular). It also provides evidence of the positive effect of the extra support the Pupil Premium grant gave the children over Key Stage 2.

The Non-PP child who was identified for 'Catch-Up' support has made significant progress by sitting a reading test in her correct chronological year group (for the first time ever in her school career) and not being too far off the expected standard for Y6.

H & F were given DfE Laptops and were closely monitored and supported with remote provision*. All P.P. pupils had this support when learning from home. F has also made significant progress attaining above expected in a reading test in her correct chronological year group (for the first time ever in her school career). Continued access to Accelerated Reader, and My-On online books, over Lockdowns may have been a contributing factor to this progress.

G also all took up an offer of in school provision in the January 2021 – March 2021 Lockdown. He was enrolled in the National Tutoring Scheme in April 2021. He has had fifteen hours of 1 to 1 support over the summer term. His Reading Fluency Assessments over the Summer Term reflected a rapid improvement (see Intervention Tracking sheet). His reading age has increased by 13 months in a 10 month period.

Phonics & Spelling Conclusions

Daily phonics and spelling intervention groups have had a significant positive impact on the progress of the pupils listed above.

A Teaching Assistant takes each of the above children out for a phonics and spelling session each day and; by using our cycle of revise, teach, practice & apply; the pupils have closed the gap on their peers.

The pupils have also benefitted from Precision Spelling Intervention – see Tracking Sheet for the Summer Term 2021 for more details.

ATTENDANCE

On 15th July 2021 average attendance for Pupil Premium Pupils for the 2020-21 Academic Year was 94.1% compared to Non-Pupil Premium at 97.1%. This lower attendance average is due to one pupil. See below:
