





Look at different maps and think about the different purposes they were made for. Look at the symbols on the maps and what each symbol represents. Record what you find.


Now create a map of your local area. This could be just of your home and garden, your street or a small village. Add symbols and a key to your map and remember to include all of the features.



We have studied the climate in Brazil. We thought about how its climate is affected by the country's location. We learnt some different weather terminology.

Keep a weather diary of your own. Note down the weather for each day and make comments under your weather diary about whether the weather you observed seemed to fit with the UK's cold temperate climate. Was each day's weather normal for this time of year?

You could do this in a table, or you can make an eBook or a video diary if you would rather.


Use websites to investigate. Otherwise, find out about modern day explorers such as Dame Ellen McArthur.

Write a quiz for your peers to complete based on your research.
