Aim High

Over the last few years the amount of progress our Year 6 pupils made between their end of Year 2 assessments and their end of Year 6 tests (SATS) has always been in line with the National Average for Primary Schools and has also been 'Above Average' and 'Well Above' at various points and in particular subjects. The percentage of pupils at Year 6, who perform at or above the 'Expected Standard', has always been above the national average percentage for Year 6 pupils.

Attainment at the end of the Reception Year, and in the Year 1 Phonics Screener, also tells a similar story with our pupils performing in line with, or above, National Average figures.
